

We Sail on Sustainable Small Ships Utilising Innovative Technology Each vessel we charter features energy-efficient engines, reduced fuel consumption using only environmentally compliant fuel types, and computerized dynamic positioning systems that minimise the need to anchor in fragile marine reserves. All carbon emissions from our cruises are 100 percent offset, and an Environmental Officer oversees each voyage to make sure all environmental protocols are observed to the letter.

We Practice Conservation and Minimise Waste

On A&K Luxury Expedition Cruises, we provide a complimentary reusable water bottle for every guest and significantly reduce other single-use plastics (such as straws, water bottles, laundry bags, cups and food portion containers). More than half of all packaging is recycled on board while the rest is fully tracked, ensuring nothing ends up in the water or on land. Onboard wastewater is treated without chlorination or other chemical processes, and supply chains for food and provisions are deliberately kept short, further reducing the overall environmental impact of your voyage.

All of our chartered vessels have been awarded the CLEANSHIP or CLEANSHIP SUPER label by Bureau Veritas, certifying their ecologically responsible operations and allowing you to explore with peace of mind.

DEC 10: Arrive Buenos Aires, Argentina

Upon arrival in Argentina's capital, you are met and transferred to the Palacio Duhau — Park Hyatt Buenos Aires, where you spend the rest of the day at leisure. Located in the fashionable residential enclave of Recoleta, your contemporary luxury hotel occupies a restored palace dating to 1934.

DEC 11: Buenos Aires | A Capital Like No Other Latin passion and European romance define Buenos Aires, a dynamic city known for its diverse architecture, vibrant contemporary art scene and lively steakhouses. Today, you might opt for a panoramic city tour complete with a tango demonstration, or simply relax and enjoy your hotel's luxurious amenities. Later this afternoon, meet with your fellow adventurers for a welcome cocktail reception. Meals: B

DEC 12: Ushuaia | Gateway to Antarctica

Fly to the charming port town of Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world and your gateway to Antarctica. After lunch at the panoramic Arakur Ushuaia Resort & Spa, opt for a nature walk, or stay put to unwind and savour views spanning the Beagle Channel and the rugged Andean mountainscape beyond. This afternoon, transfer to your ship and settle in. Later this evening, your vessel navigates into the Beagle Channel before heading out to sea. Meals: BLD

DEC 13: At Sea | Cruising the Drake Passage Awake to your first morning aboard. Today, your vessel cruises the Drake Passage, the 600-mile-wide confluence of the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. Meals: BLD

DEC 14: At Sea | Cruising the Drake Passage

Continue cruising today and join your naturalists on the deck to look for various species of whale and abundant seabirds, which join other mammals in feasting on the krill-rich waters of the Drake Passage. Later in the evening, chat with experts about the wildlife spotted today and learn about the next day's itinerary. Meals: BLD

DEC 15: Antarctica | The White Continent

Today, conditions permitting, 'Le Lyrial' cruises the Antarctic Sound. Located at the northernmost tip of the Antarctic mainland, the sound harbours a proliferation of giant icebergs and one of Antarctica's largest colonies of Adélie penguin. Your Expedition Team scouts for opportunities to land on remote, biodiverse islands. Meals: BLD

DEC 16: Antarctica | Islands of Discovery

This morning your Expedition Team may chart a course for the South Shetland Islands, an enclave of captivating history, geology and wildlife. Here, your team looks for the best opportunities to visit volcanic islands and historic sites, as well as gentoo, Adélie and chinstrap penguin rookeries. Meals: BLD

DEC 17: Antarctica | Scenic Waterways

Slowly cruising amid this vast expanse of virgin sea ice, the Captain uses the ship's advanced navigation systems to thread through naturally open channels and transit areas where the frozen layer is thinnest. As this stunning Arctic scene drifts past, keep your eyes peeled for polar bear and high arctic gulls. Throughout your voyage, your ship's luxurious amenities afford ample opportunities to unwind with daily wellness classes, dips in the indoor and outdoor pools, relaxing sauna sessions or visits to the full-service salon and spa. There is also a wide variety of onboard enrichment opportunities on offer, such as hands-on scientific research projects, visits to the ship's lab and bridge, stargazing sessions, seamanship and polar survival workshops, cooking demonstrations, photo contests and more. The anticipation builds with each passing day as your Captain charts the clearest path to your expedition's objective: the seldom-visited geographic North Pole. Meals: BLD

JUL 18-19: Geographic North Pole | Standing at 90° North Conditions permitting, continue the quests of Matthew Henson, Robert Peary, Frederick Cook, Roald Amundsen and other elite Arctic explorers as you seek out the



geographic North Pole over the coming days. Upon finding the most favourable path through the pack ice, the Captain endeavours to position the GPS antennae of 'Le Commandant Charcot' directly on 90° North latitude, the coordinate marking the geographic North Pole. The culmination of your intrepid expedition is marked by a Champagne toast and celebration on the ship's helideck. The following day, the Captain seeks out a nearby floe suitable for a gangway landing onto the ice's surface. Then, your Expedition Team leads the way across the ice for a once-ina-lifetime photo op and perhaps, if you are willing, a polar plunge. Meals: BLD

JUL 20-25: Sea Ice of the Arctic Ocean | Return Voyage The next days at sea are filled with enrichment programs and, conditions permitting, opportunities to venture to the ice. Along the way, you may even have the chance to hike on the ice or kayak through open leads. There is also time to reflect on your spectacular voyage and share your experiences with the newfound friends you've made along the way. During the transition through the MIZ back into more open waters, keep watch for harbour and bearded seal, walrus and a multitude

of seabirds. As the ship draws closer to Longyearbyen, your Captain hosts a festive farewell cocktail reception, gala dinner and celebration — a fittingly spectacular conclusion to your once-in-a-lifetime voyage. Meals: BLD





MAR1: Arrive Zanzibar Islands, Tanzania

Arrive on Zanzibar's main island and transfer to the Park Hyatt Zanzibar located in historic Stone Town. DAY 1: Arrive Athens, Greece
